Rob Macgregor's Mustang 30 Dark Horse risked being swept over the line for a well judged start and was rewarded by winning IRC Class 2 and Solo Overall ahead of newbie Don Forster's First 31.7 Memory Maker. Stephen Thomas's C&C 115 Azora won IRC 1 and Edward Rogers on J/97 Joyride (another newbie) won the Double Handed class.

Results were announced and informal bottle prizes awarded in Lymington, followed by the formal 2024 prize giving and a convivial dinner, when the newcomers were particularly welcomed and tales of derring-do swapped.

The breeze for the return leg the next day unfortunately materialised too late and despite efforts to run a short windward/leeward course, racing had to be abandoned.
